## TIMES EDITOR HAS BEEN APPOINTED NEW POSTMASTER

J. A. KNAPP, PRESENT INCUMB-ENT, WILL RETIRE AFTER EIGHT YEARS SERVICE—MISS BRILL TO REMAIN

Official advices from Washington, this week, confirmed the normation of C. E. Peterson, editor of The Binford Times, to become postmaster at Binford, succeeding J. A. Knapp, who has held the position for the past eight years. The new appointee will assume charge as soon as the usual formalities are completed, such as execution of bond and commission issued by the postoffice department.
