

POSTAL SERVICE IS TO HAVE A WEEK FOR BRACING UP

WEEK OF MAY 1-8 HAS BEEN DESIGNATED POSTAL WEEK BY POSTMASTER GENERAL HUBERT WORK

During the week of May 1 to 8th inclusive the general public will be urged to observe Postal Improvement Week, according to Postmaster C. E. Peterson.

Hubert Work, Postmaster General says:

"The postal service of the United States affects more people in this country either directly or indirectly than any other agency whether it be public or private. It was established and is maintained for the benefit of and use "of the people, by the people, and for the people." Our ideal postal service, therefore, is that service which discharges all of the functions of the postal establishment to the satisfaction of all of the people all of the time."

The purpose of "Postal Improvement Week" is to acquaint the public with the workings of the post office department and with the methods of handling and caring for the mails.

Postmaster Peterson asks the patrons of the local postoffice to assist in the observance of the week and to become better acquainted with all the ways and means of handling and caring for Uncle Sam's big job—the mails.
