
RURAL MAIL ROUTES TO BE INSPECTED IN APRIL

In April, according to instructions received from Washington, all mail boxes on the rural mail routes, will be inspected. The inspection will cover position of the box, painting and the lettering of the name of the family on the box. The post office insists on these boxes being, weather proof and being fit receptacles for the mail, according to a bulletin received at the Hinford postoffice from Washington.

It is desired by the department to have all rural mail boxes painted white and the name painted on each side of the box in black letters. The post on which the mail box stands should also be painted white. Painting should be done once each year, thereby adding to the appearance of the box and increasing its longevity. It was further stated in the bulletin.
