## FARM UNIONS FAVOR GRAIN GROWERS' PLAN

The general offices of the American Farm Bureau federation, under whose leadership the National Co-Operative Grain Marketing plan incorporated as the United States Grain Growers was inaugurated, has announced that reports from all parts of the country showed that organized agriculture was practically a unit in favor of the plan.

Reports of favorable action on the plan, it was announced, have been received from farmers' organizations in Kansas, Iowa, Nebraska, Washington and Idaho. The Wheat Growers association of Washington and Idaho, it was said, has voted to join the United States Grain Growers, Inc. en masse on the basis of pooling 100 per cent of a crop.

The American Farm Bureau announced the biggest single sale since the inception of the wool pool marketing department of the bureau. This was the sale of 1,100,000 pounds to an eastern mill at an average price of from 20 to 27 cents.

The next session of the farmers livestock marketing committee of 15 will meet in Chicago on May 25.
