TWO KILLED AND FOUR INJURED IS TOLL OF ONE DAY

GRIGGS COUNTY FARMERS KILL ED AND INJURED IN MISHAP LAST SATURDAY—LUVERNI MAN COMMITS SUICIDE

A virtual riot of accidents causing two deaths, visited upon Griggs county on the last day of the month. In both cases prominent farmers of the county are victims.

Jerry Hogan, 70, a farm hand of the F. D. Williams farm, south of Cooperstown, was run over by a tank of grain on the Williams farm Saturday. He was repairing a loose tire on a rear wheel of the wason when the horses hitched to it started away, pulling the wagon over him, crushing his intestines and breaking a number of ribs through his lungs, ite died three hours later. Hogan's home is said to be Davenport, Iowa, and a son there hus been notified.

Hogan, who was conscious following the accident, declared himself to have been to blame for the accident. Carl Elsais, 40 years of age, a prominent farmer residing north of Cooperstown, received fatal injury Saturdity night from which he died early Sunday. While leading the horses into the barn, one kicked him in the head. He never regained consciousness. He is survived by his

wife and two on.

chrown from a horse early Saturday.

A badly broken right leg was the

Simeon Jenson, a farmer of the Jessie community, suffered very serious injury Saturday when his right hand was caught in a wheel and best on a threshing separator. The hand and arm were badly lacerated and the skin seriously burned by the fast belt. It is believed that the

hand will be saved.

Chas. Engehretson, one of the leading farmers in Washburn township, just west of Cooperstown, was hurried to Vailey City Saturday for the services of an eye specialist. It is believed the eye, which became inflamed by some foreign matter, will have to be taken out.

On Saturday night automobiles owned by B. Herigstad and Ediund Brothers smashed together on the road four miles north of Cooperstown. The Ediund car was damaged beyond repair and Mr. Edlund was seriously cut inbout the face by glass.

Peter Christianson, a prominent

farmer living near Luverne, committed suicide. His body was found Saturday hanging by a rope. No reason can be ascribed for his act.
