The figures for domestic animals in 1910 are not very closely comparable with those for 1920, since the present census was taken in January, before the breeding season had begun, while the 1910 census was taken in April, or about the middle of the breeding season, and included many spring calves, colts, etc.

## VICTORY MEDAL FOR ALL EX-SERVICE MEN

Every man who served during the World War and was honorably discharged from the Army, is entitled to a Victory Medal. All that is necessary to secure this medal is to forward the discharge to the Victory Medal Dept., Aberdeen, S. Dak., the Victory Medal Dept., State Capitol, Pierre, S. Dak., the Victory Medal Dept., State Capitol, Bismarck, N. Dak., or the Victory Medal Dept., at Federal Building Minneapolis, Minnesota, and the office on duty will fill out the application and return it to the applicant for his signature. The discharge will not leave the local office, so there need be no uneasiness about its being lost.

In case of death the next of kin is entitled to this medal, and it can be obtained by furnishing this office with the name, organization and serial number, if possible, of the deceased soldier.
