The session of the District Court came to a close last Friday, the numerous cases on the docket having been disposed of. Most of the criminal cases, mostly violations of the prohibition law, were closed by imposing on the prisoners sentences ranging from ninety days in jail and a \$200 fine to indeterminate sentences of one to three years in the penitentiary at Bismarck. One of the whiskey runners forfeited a \$1,000 bond by failing to appear. The Walum bank cases, as stated in last week's issue, will be tried in some other county in the fall. In the J. W. Harris vs. Farmers State Bank case, verdict was rendered in favor of the bank, with privilege of appeal. The verdict in the case of Hogle vs. Overby was rendered in favor of Mr. Overby.
