

# SPRING TERM OF DISTRICT COURT IS COMPLETED

**HAROLD BURNS PLEADS GUILTY  
TO TRANSPORTING BOOZE AND  
IS SENTENCED FOUR MONTHS  
AND FINE OF \$200.00**

The May term of district court, with Judge Engert presiding, was completed last Thursday, after disposing of the entire calendar.

The cases were determined as follows:

Lima vs. Lima, for payment of services. Judgment for Martin Lima against Peter Lima for \$100.00 and costs.

Kittl Knutson against John E. Johnson, for payment of oats and hay raised on the Knutson farm. Judgment for Knutson for \$460.00 and costs. Johnson raised a counter claim for conversion of flax which was not allowed. This claim amounted to \$1200.00.

Larson against Chris Klink, claim for damages for use of Larson's farm against Larson's consent and will. Judgment for Klink, jury finding he had leased the property from the former owner, and was entitled to possession.

The above were jury cases.

The court case was Rule vs. Peter Boisjolie for the cancellation of a contract for deed. Court held that Rule had not established a breach of the contract sufficient to warrant a cancellation.

In the case of State vs. Wm. Perkins and Harold Burns, Burns entered a plea of guilty to the charge of transporting liquor, and was given a sentence of 4 months and \$200 fine. Perkins decided to plead not guilty and was held to the District Court in November, 1921, and will be out upon \$500.00 bail, if this can be raised for him.
