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Hotels of Griggs county received an average score of 90.2 per cent as compared with the state average of 89.1 percent for 1928, according to the report of R. O. Baird, State Food Commissioner who has charge of the enforcement of the hotel law, together with other regulatory measures of the state.

Each year inspectors are sent out to examine the rooms and kitchens of the 612 hotels in the state and to score them according to cleanliness, safety and convenience of guests. Hotel proprietors are required to conform with the state law and provide fire extinguishers, fumigate or clean up their premises if necessary, order new mattresses and springs to replace worn-out unsanitary ones, etc.

Hotels in Logan County led the state with an average score of 96.2 percent, while the Oliver County score was the lowest, 76.8 per cent.

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
