

PLAY DAY WAS THE BEST EVER HELD

Bliford pupils were very successful in the athletic events, winning four first prizes, seven seconds and five thirds.

Cleo Knapp won second prize in the potato race in her class.

In the 75 yard dash for girls, Marie Jacobs won first and in the running broad jump, Bernice Alfson got first and Marie Jacobs, second.

The 100-yard dash for girls was won by Evelyn Amundson, first, and Evelyn Alfson, second.

Evelyn Amundson won first and Gladys Hanstad, second, in the running high jump; and Gladys Hanstad captured second, and Evelyn Alfson third in the running broad jump.

Hillard Alfson and Grant Anderson won second and third places in the 50 yard dash.

George M. was second in the potato race, and Arthur Amundson third in the 100-yard dash.

Herman Asmus took third money in both the running high jump and running broad jump.
