

BOOZE RUNNER IS NABBED AFTER AN EXCITING CHASE

GRIGGS COUNTY SHERIFF AND DEPUTY MAKE BIG CATCH ON SUNDAY—RUNNER RELEASED ON \$500 CASH BAIL

Sheriff Nelson has in his custody a Cadillac Eight and a large quantity of Sunnybrook and Scotch whiskey, as a result of a chase with a whiskey runner, on Sunday. An exact inventory has not yet been made, but it is estimated that there are about 30 quarts in the load.

Mr. Nelson had been notified by the sheriff at Carrington to be on the lookout for the booze-laden car. He and Deputy Solberg immediately started westward from Cooperstown in the hopes of intercepting them in case they took another route than the state road. Just north of Sutton, the suspects, with two automobiles, were encountered. The parties in the leading car, a Buick, paid no attention to the sheriff's command "to stop," even after a few shots had been fired in their direction. The occupant in the rear car who it is believed was carrying all the booze, thereupon turned and headed westward rather than attempt to pass the authorities. The sheriff and deputy started in pursuit and had it not been for a mishap to the Cadillac it isn't likely that the runner would have been overtaken, but as he was making a turn near Juanita, the engine was "killed" and failed to start again. He abandoned the car and tried to make his escape on foot. Tracks in the snow, however, made pursuit easy, and he was captured while hiding in a coal car standing on the side track in Juanita.

He was taken to Cooperstown and a hearing was held before Justice Rekedal. Examination was waived and \$500 cash bail was furnished. County Attorney Rustad, of Moorhead, represented the defendant, who gave his name as William Mungerson.
