

Hannaford Enterprise: During the three "Turkey Days" of last week, Kimball Bros., paid out \$19,500 for dressed turkeys which they bought and shipped from Hannaford. Last year the same firm bought here in town \$6,200 worth; so that the value of turkeys shipped from this point has more than tripled in one year. Last year the price paid was 40 cents a pound; this year they paid 30c a pound for turkeys for which they had contracted, and two or three cents less for turkeys brought in during the sale days. As these figures include only turkeys bought by this one firm in three days, the total poultry products disposed of by Griggs county farmers during the fall months will mount up into a large total, although no exact figures are available. Large shipments of poultry have been frequent for several weeks past, and besides this there are many who derive a considerable revenue throughout the year from the sale of eggs. It is undoubtedly true that this year at least poultry raising has been more profitable than grain raising.
