WOULD-BE MURDERER, JACOB NAGEL, COMMETTED SUICIDE BODY FOUND IN A STRAW STACK BUNDAY EVENING

Jacob Nagel, would-be assessin of Mr. and Mrs. Hendrickson, of Steele county, was found, dead, last Sunday evening in a straw stack, one mile east of the scene of his crime. A correspondent from that neigh-

borhood sends The Times the news of the discovery in the following letter: The body of Jacob Nagel was found

Sunday, April 10, at about six o'clock in a straw stack on Mr. C. Wang's farm, one mile from the Heudrickson home. Mr. Wang's son, Oscar, went to the straw-stack to bring home the cows. Seeing in the straw the corner of what he supposed to be a horse bianket, he took hold of it and found it to be the overcast of the would-be murderer, who had been almost covered by the straw scattered by the cattle that fed there.

The discovery drew a large crowd of searchers who had vainly sought over the surrounding country. Later in the evening the coroner, Dr. Giasscock, of Finley, came out to make examination. The man was found to have shot himself through the heart. The suicide is supposed to have taken place at about eight o'clock Sunday morning, April 3rd, when a report was heard by the neighbors.
