

# HOME TALENT PLAY IS READY FOR THE PUBLIC

**"ALL A MISTAKE," THREE-ACT,  
COMEDY DRAMA, TO BE PRE-  
SENTED IN OPERA HOUSE TO-  
MORROW EVENING**

Only a little "brushing up" to smoothen off the rough edges remains to be done at the dress rehearsal this evening, and the home talent play will be ready for public presentation tomorrow (Friday) evening, March 4, at 8:30 sharp.

The characters are: Capt. Obadiah Skinner, (O. D. Freer) a retired sea captain; Lieut. George Richmond, (Dr. E. F. Ringlee) his nephew, who starts the trouble; Richard Hamilton, (C. E. Peterson) a country gentleman; Ferdinand Lighthouse, (F. H. Bixby) who falls in love, doncher-know; Nellie Richmond, (Elizabeth Monsebrotten) George's wife; Nellie Huntington, (Nora Bjerke) a friend; Nellie Skinner (Florence Greenland) antiquated but still looking for a man; Nellie McIntyre, (Mrs. H. J. Hanson) a servant.

The plot is a good one. George and his bride arrive at his uncle's home, expecting to find him dying, but find it a mistake. George has married unknown to his uncle, who has threatened to disinherit him unless he marries Nellie Huntington. He pretends that Nellie Huntington is his wife and that his wife is her friend. The fact that all the women are named "Nellie" creates the greatest confusion imaginable. Oak Farm, the scene of the play, adjoins the State Insane asylum, and at last all are mistaken for lunatics. Continuous action and a laugh in every line.

Admission prizes have been made at 75c for adults and 35c for children. Proceeds are to be used for the purchase of new uniforms for the base ball team. Following the play, a dance will be given. The Binford orchestra will furnish music between acts and also for the dance.
