

SUNDAY DANCES TABOOED

Sunday dancing was placed under a ban in North Dakota by Attorney General Sveinbjorn Johnson, last Tuesday in letters dispatched to all proprietors of public dance halls in the state.

Attorney General Johnson, who is in charge of the state-license department, said country barn dances had become so numerous in North Dakota, that many communities are scandalized by dancing after midnight on Saturday night and on Sunday night. While most cities have their own ordinances regulating dancing, the country dance halls have escaped this regulation, the attorney general said.

The ban is placed in accordance with the law which prohibits public sports on Sunday in the state with specified exceptions.
