

Nearly a Million Wall Eyed Pike Have Been Planted in Red Willow

On Tuesday of last week F. G. Lewis, manager of the Red Willow Lake Park association, received word that a supply of pike fry was available for Red Willow lake by sending someone to Spiritwood lake to get them from the new state fish hatchery that was placed in operation this spring. J. L. Moore, of Binford was sent to Spiritwood and returned with about 500,000 fry, and again on Sunday another supply of about 400,000 was placed in Red Willow.

These fish eggs were secured by E. T. Judd, commissioner, from Kenora, Ont., Canada, and placed in the state hatchery at Spiritwood, and under the expert care of Alf Eastgate, deputy commissioner, were successfully hatched, with the result that several of our lakes and rivers are now well stocked with pike.

We certainly appreciate what our state game and fish department is doing to increase our fishing in the state and also that our own Red Willow lake is numbered among the best. Come again Mr. Judd.
