When he reached Revere the bank was informе of the discovery, and an attempt was made to intercept the car in Hannaford. It was afterwards lear 1ed that a Studebaker and a Ford had been been been after the suspected car had been been near Revere. From here the Studebaker had continued east and the Ford turned north. It was a 1,some suspicion in Revere the event ing before the robbery, so it is very probable that there were two gangs of robbers co-operating in this bank cracking job. No valuables of any kind were secured by the robbers from the bank and with the recovery of the bank of documentment only thing missing is a bunch of cancelled township warrants; but as venirs of the visit of the burglars the bank has a totally wrecked safe and a somewhat damaged building. ì
