Hannaford Enterprise: No further trace has been found of the robbers who broke into the State Bank of Revere last Tuesday morning. It seems rather strange that the robbers should re-visit the scene of their crime the very same day, but such seems to have been the case, though no one suspected their identity until it was too late to apprehend them. On the afternoon of the same day as the robbery Chas. Palm's hired man was hauling a load of grain to Revere and met two young men in a Studebaker Six. While they were still at a distance he saw them throw something from the car, and when he reached the place he stopped to pick it up and found it was a bag containing papers and documents that had been taken from the bank. When he reached Revere the bank was informed of the discovery, and an attempt was made to intercept the car in Hannaford. It was afterwards learned that a Studebaker and a Ford had passed through Hannaford soon after the suspected car had been seen near Revere. From here the Studebaker had continued east and the Ford turned north. It was a Ford that had been seen and created some suspicion in Revere the evening before the robbery, so it is very probable that there were two gangs of robbers co-operating in this bank cracking job. No valuables of any kind were secured by the robbers from the bank and with the recovery of the bank of documents the only thing missing is a bunch of cancelled township warrants; but as souvenirs of the visit of the burglars the bank has a totally wrecked safe and a somewhat damaged building.
