## AUMOND ERLANDSON DEAD

After baving been afflicted for several weeks with a complication of ailments, Aumond Erland son who formerly lived about a mile north of town, was sudder ly siezed by an attack of paralysis of the throat, the first of last week, and his condition was thought to be more or less ser .ous from that time on. He was given the best possible care contiqually, many from here giving all possible assistance in nursing him in addition to the medical care rendered, but, Providence decreed that the life was to be no more and at eleven o'clock Saturday A. M., the sufferer passed away being aged fifty-one ears.
