

A NEW CHURCH

A Free Methodist church has been erected this spring in the neighborhood of Albert Turk's and John Kline's homes, seven miles southwest of Binford, and it will be dedicated sometime during the fall. Mr. Kline was in town Tuesday and took out a wagon load of furniture, including chairs, centre tables, etc., purchased of Knapp & Buchheit which will be used for the present, until the regular church furniture is secured. There will be a service at the new church, tomorrow (Friday) evening, and a quarterly meeting will be held on Sunday.
