

## NETTIE GUY DISCHARGED

After being confined in the state-insane asylum for less than three months, Nettie Guy has been discharged as "cured" and sent to Pennsylvania where her relatives reside. The news of Miss Guy's discharge was received here this morning when Judge Hanson, ex-officio chairman of the insanity board, received official notice from the asylum authorities.

The young woman was admitted to the asylum Jan. 20 and the order for her discharge was made April 17.

Never before has a Cass county insane patient been cured in as short a time as Miss Guy and the news of her discharge was received at the court house today with considerable surprise.

Miss Guy was well known in Fargo as a trained nurse. Last fall she was arrested on a charge of murdering her infant child. The dead body of an infant was found concealed in a valise which was under the bed which Miss Guy had occupied in the home of a private family on Tenth Street North.

An inquest was held and Miss Guy was charged with murder. For several days after the discovery of the dead body of the infant, Miss Guy remained in hiding but was at last arrested by Chief Gowland in a house in the hollow district. She waived preliminary examination and was committed to the county jail. After being confined several weeks, she was examined by the insanity board and ordered committed to the state institution by a vote of two to three, Judge Hanson alone voting against the commitment of the young woman.

For about a year prior to the birth of the murdered infant, Miss Guy resided in southern California. It has been common talk on the street that a Fargo business man had been the cause of Miss Guy's fall from grace and the powerful influences brought to bear to have her committed and thus escape trial on the serious charge of murder, together with the young woman's speedy discharge from the state institution, it is argued, support the street talk.—Forum.
