

CHARGE OF MANSLAUGHTER

On Wednesday of last week, Charley Burch, a veterinarian of Aneta entered the restaurant of S. E. Shinn at Aneta, and being intoxicated, began to use abusive and obscene language. Shinn demanded silence on the part of Burch to the extent of that kind of language, but when Burch continued in spite of Shinn's efforts to stop him, Shinn took him by the shoulder and forcibly ejected him from the building. Burch was not able to control himself and fell from the sidewalk, striking his head against the hub of a wagon standing near. The incident caused the death of Burch who died within an hour afterward. The coroner's jury brought in a verdict to the effect that Burch came to his death through the contributory negligence of Shinn in ejecting him from the building while intoxicated and allowing his head to strike against the wagon wheel. Upon the verdict the states attorney preferred a charge of man-slaughter in the second degree against Shinn, who was bound over to the district court under \$500 bonds.
