

SUICIDE AT BLABON

Mrs. Harry Brown, of Near Blabon, Committed Suicide Last Week.

Hope Pioneer: Tuesday afternoon Dr. Hedding received a hurry call from near Blabon, on account of a case of poisoning. When he arrived at the Brown residence and found that he was too late for the patient had died about forty minutes before he arrived. He at once turned his visit into a coroner's inquest and decided that deceased had met death by poisoning administered by her own hand.

Soon the news that Mrs. Harry Brown had committed suicide reached town. The young woman's husband furnished the Pioneer with the true story of the tragedy. It seems that the young woman was subject to spells of dispondency and it is supposed that while in one of her meloncholy fits she took the poison that ended her life.

There is a sad thing in connection with this tragedy and it is that just one year ago the 4th of this month Harry Brown and Mary E. Wilson were married and that one year from that time lacking one days life's golden dream was shattered and the lives of both blighted. The bereaved husband is stunned at his great loss and can hardly realize that his bride has left him. Mrs. Brown was of a very sensitive nature and this coupled with her despondency caused her to take the unhappy step.

The remains were taken to Cooperstown and the funeral held at the W. H. Butler residence on Thursday.
