

POLICE CAPTURE McHENRY MAN

**Carl Anderson, of McHenry, Held
at Moorhead on Charge of
Stealing Cutlery.**

Fargo Forum: Chief Malvey received information last night that Carl Anderson, a young man from McHenry, Foster county, N. D., who he arrested on suspicion, last Saturday, stating that the prisoner was wanted for the alleged theft of cutlery and other property belonging to H. S. Halvorson for whom Anderson worked in different capacities.

This morning Sheriff J. J. Atkins and Deputy F. B. Keeler arrived in Moorhead and properly identified Anderson as the man wanted in McHenry. After the identification was completed a carriage was called and Anderson was taken for a ride over to Fargo and placed in the city jail there for safekeeping until the departure of the evening train for the west.

The prisoner, Anderson, aroused the suspicions of the Moorhead police by his peculiar methods in the effort to dispose of knives of different qualities he had in his possession. He was put through a searching examination by Chief Malvey and he got badly twisted as to how he became possessed of the property. The knives bore the trade name of the merchant at McHenry who complains of the loss of the knives, etc., and there are other articles which answer the description of stuff the merchant has missed since the departure of the man Anderson. He will be prosecuted to the fullest extent.
