

MEAT MARKET CHANGED HANDS

F. G. Lewis Disposed of His Interests to J. C. Thingelstad.

A deal was closed last Saturday whereby J. C. Thingelstad becomes the owner of the Pioneer Meat Market, formerly owned by F. G. Lewis.

Under the ownership of Mr. Lewis, the meat market has been kept in first class shape—always neat and clean—and has even caused words of commendation on its sanitary condition from the pure food inspector, who visited here last fall. Much of this credit is due, however, to J. D. Reid, the butcher. There are no better meat carvers in this neck of the woods than "Jack." He has made himself very popular with the buying public. As to his future intentions he is yet undecided.

There is no reason to suspect that the same service wont be accorded the patrons of the shop in the future. Mr. Thingelstad has secured the services of L. Jacobs, a competent butcher, who will have complete charge. Mr. Jacobs is no novice in the meat business. He served an apprenticeship of fourteen years with the Stewart meat market at Grand Forks, and was with E. E. Downe, of Cooperstown for two years. Since then he has conducted a shop of his own in Jessie.

Mr. Jacobs is a man of family. They will move here in a short time.
