A complaint was made by the game warden before Judge J. H. Campbell reciting the infraction of the game law and a warrant was issued for their arrest. Tuesday evening Special Game Warden Thornley and Constable Malmstead went out to the place where the defendants were working and made the arrest and brought them to town. The defendants each put up a cash bond in the sum of \$100 for their appearance before the justice Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock. In the meantime they secured an attorney to look after their defense and yesterday afternoon the defendants through their attorney filed an affidavit of prejudice against Justice Campbell, and on motion for a change of venue, the proceedings were certified and sent to Justice S. W. McOuat.

We are informed that the cases against the defendants were dismissed this morning by States Attorney C. B. Craven on the ground of insufficient evidence and the defendants were given their liberty.—McHenry Free Press.
