Ł . the bottom of the buggy and bound-C , ing back, the end of the barrel cut a t half moon shape bruise on his neck. h The death of young Earl is a hard t . blow to his relatives, and doubly so, v since it is remembered that his fathе er met his death in an unnatural n 1 manner a few years ago.
