Succumbed To Consumption last Friday

Miss Agnes Knapp died last Friday afternoon at four o'clock, in a sanitarium in Pine City, Minnesota, where she had gone about four months ago to seek relief from that dread disease, consumption.

The sad news of Miss Agnes' death cast a shadow over the entire community, for most of her short but happy life was spent among us, and every heart was touched with sympathy for the bereaved ones, from whose fireside the light had fled. ter of Mrs. Clara Knapp, whom she leaves to mourn her loss, besides three brothers, Olaf, Ivar and Manfred.

The remains arrived here from Pine City, Monday, and were taken to her home where the body was viewed by many until yesterday when short services were held before removal to the United Lutheran church where a large number of admiring friends had gathered to pay their last sad respects to the memory of the deceased.

The funeral services were conducted by Rev. T. E. Sweger. Songs were touchingly rendered by the choir. The flowers were many and beautiful, but not more beautiful than the face that rested so peacefully among them.
