Leininger was picked up by the Fargo police Wednesday and was brought to the station to get a chance to so er up. He became id and a physician was called and attended to him. Apparently his condition became greatly improved and he was able to walk around and was feeling in the best of spirits.

Last night he began to com-plain again, and up in the exam-ination of a doctor it was found that his heart was in bad shape, started for Fargo vesterday.

This morning City Weighmaster Coleman was talking to the old man about 7:30 o'click and at that time be seemed all right. At about 8:20 De-k Sergeant Bowers and City Weighmaster Coleman made a trip through the cells and thought that Leininger was sleeping. Coleman bent ov-er him to assist in making him more comfortabe and found life was extinct. He had gone to sleep and never awoke.

When brought to the station there was found on his person several thousand dollars grain checks which had nev r been cashed.
