

REBEKAH LODGE WON THE PRIZE

Were Successful in Degree Team
Work in the State Contest
at Grand Forks.

With a determination to keep up the record set by their brothers when they won the cup at the district Odd Fellows meeting held at Rogers last winter, the degree team of the Wild Rose Rebekah lodge of Binford went to Grand Forks last Monday to compete in the state contest for a prize of \$75. Two other teams—Larimore and Mayville—took part in the contest. Binford won first honors and the prize, with Larimore a close second.

It is quite a "feather in their hats" when it is considered that the Larimore and Mayville lodges are much older organizations. The Larimore lodge was the fourth one in the state to be organized and the Mayville lodge the thirty-second, while the Binford lodge was sixty-seventh. The ladies are entitled to a great deal of credit for the splendid advertising they have given Binford.

"In the Rebekah competition three teams were represented, Mayville, Larimore and Binford, the latter team carrying off the honors and the prize of \$75.

The Binford team, however, hailing from Griggs county, were successful in carrying off the prize by a narrow margin of two points. Larimore was a close second. The Binford team was an unknown quantity and the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs who did not know that the thriving little town was on the map found out last evening in a very emphatic manner by their splendid drill work.
