

# FARMERS SHOW PROPER SPIRIT

## The Rocky Road to Wimbledon Cleared From Rock—Good Work Was Done.

If the farmers thruout the state would do as Henry Carter one of Stutsman county's prosperous farmers and hired man did one day this week, the state would have much better roads and the owners of vehicles and autos would not have so many repair bills to pay. Mr. Carter and his hired man started out one day this week and dug all the rock off of about four miles of rocky road leading towards Wimbledon. The road that they cleaned of rock was one of the rockiest roads in this vicinity as one coulee in particular was almost impassible, but now there is not a rock in the road any place between town and four miles west of the Jas. Murdoch farm. The commercial club hired a man to pick those off between here and the Murdock corner and Mr. Carter and his hired man picked them off the rest of the distance to the Courteney road west of Wimbledon, using a team of horses to roll some of the large ones out of the road. If the farmers will follow Mr. Carter's example the roads would soon be cleared of rock. Traveling over the roads we notice some farmers plowing up the roads and hauled rock off the fields and dumping them in the road to be run over this fall by the large grain tanks filled with over a hundred bushels of wheat. Oh, no, they do not damage the wagons nor do they hurt the horses. They only damage automobiles—that is what some of them seem to think. But see how much easier a load draws over a good, smooth hard road, and see if it does not pay to take care of your roads.—Wimbledon News.
