In Order to Compete with Fares on G. N. Cut-off, the N. P. Has Lowered Rates.

A new passenger rate, effecting the towns on the Cooperstown branch and on the main line from Buffalo to Casselton, went into effect on September 7. This change has been made to compete with the fares on the new G. N. cut-off. For instance, people living on the branch could go to Hannaford and make connections on the G. N. for Fargo for less money, and with the same accommodations.

Just what difference it will make in the traffic on the N. P. is hard to guess at, but it is sure they will lose some business. People, as a rule, do not find much pleasure in riding on the train, so naturally will take the shortest route, as long as they don't lose much time in waiting for trains.

The new rate from Binford to Fargo on the N. P. line is \$2.40, a reduction of 60 cents.
