

## Car Destroyed at Finley.

Friday evening about 8 o'clock a through freight train running east came to a stop at the water tank with a car on fire, where the crew attempted to put the fire out, but were unsuccessful, and the village fire department was called upon for assistance. After working with the fire for over an hour it was given up as a bad job, and the car was hauled south to the end of the passing track and allowed to burn until it got through. The car was a Grand Trunk car, loaded at Portland, Oregon, with 12-inch wooden water pipes, tarred inside and out, and when the tar got to going it was impossible to make an impression on it. The fire consumed the car completely, and warped the rails on which it stood out of place.—Finley Beacon.
