Tolna Tribune: On Sunday morning, Dec. 31st, John Moran, a farmer near Hamar, N. D., had a most horrible experience when calling at the home of his neighbor, Joe Peterson, he found the door wide open and the sister, Miss Christina Peterson, lying over the threshold apparently dead and Mr. Peterson in bed and unconscious. Mr. Moran immediately called help and everything possible was done for the young people. On Tuesday they were taken to Fargo, but nothing could be done to save them. Mr. Peterson died immediately after being taken from the train and the sister remained in an unconscious condition until the following Tuesday, when she died. No definite cause has been obtained as neither regained consciousness, but it is thought that they had been overcome by gas from the stove, the girl however being able to get to the door and open it but was unable to go so far. With the door open and the thermometer at thirty below, death was almost certain. At the present writing no relatives of the unfortunate people have been found. The bodies are held in the undertaking rooms at Fargo until relatives can be found.
