

THE SPERRY JURY IN DISAGREEMENT

**Twelve Men Discharged After
Being Out 65 Hours—May
be Retried.**

After being twice sent back to consider further the evidence in the case of Clyde Sperry, charged with causing the death of Kenneth McKenzie, the jury was discharged Tuesday afternoon at 3 o'clock after being out 65 hours.

Tuesday morning the jury the second time reported a disagreement, but was again sent back, but in the afternoon the foreman told the court it was impossible for the jury to agree. It is learned on good authority the jury stood eight to four for the guilt of the accused.

The impression prevails that this will end the case unless the father of the dead boy insists upon a retrial.
