

When the case of Clyde Sperry, charged with the murder of Kenneth McKenzie, is called for trial in the district court of Nelson county at the opening of the January term for trial, a petition for a change of venue will be filed by the prosecution. To what county the case will be sent in the event that such a change is granted, is uncertain. Clyde Sperry's case has already been tried once in Nelson county, resulting in the jury failing to reach an agreement. One of the most interesting features of this case is found in the fact that at one time Sperry is alleged to have made a complete confession of the affair.
