Courier: On complaint of one Mike Holten a warrant for the arrest of Andrew Turing was issued last Wednesday, the complaint being maintaining a public nuisance and selling liquor, or in other words, blind pigging. Mr. Turing was arrested by Chief of Police Christianson and taken before Justice Rearick. A continuance was asked for until ten o'clock Thursday morning which was granted. Thursday Turing had a preliminary examination. The state presented some strong evidence but the defendant did not go on the stand. There was nothing else for the justice to do but bind the defendant over to the next term of the district court, which he did fixing bond at \$500.

Mr. Turing was unable to furnish bond at that time and was remanded to the custody of Sheriff Lee. The evidence also convicted Holten in our opinion and we presume he will also have to stand trial for the same crime. There has been altogether too much of this sort of thing going on and we are pleased that our officials are making earnest endeavor to suppress the illegal sale of liquor in this community. There are others yet who need a dose of the law and no matter how smooth they are—and some of them are certainly smooth—they will eventually get caught, so our advice to them is to quit while they are free. Every man is supposed to be innocent until proven guilty and so it is with Mr. Turing, at the same time according to the evidence furnished by the states attorney in justice court, the state has certainly got a strong case against him.

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
