Theodore K. Curry Dead.

News reached here yesterday of the death of Theo. K. Curry, formerly of Binford and once owner of the Binford Times, late of Hope. He had been suffering from cancer of the stomach and died at the

Mound Park Sanitorium at St. Paul

on Tuesday, June 1st.

Mr. Curry was born in Boscobel,
Wis., on January 4, 1876, and was at
the time of his death 39 years of
age. He came to North Dakota in
1884, and taught school in Barnes
county for five years. He located in

Binford in 1903 and on May 7 issued the first number of the Binford Times, then owned by Pepper & Keene. He worked in that capacity

for about seven months when he purchased the plant. He left here in 1908 for Buffalo Springs and filed on a claim, later taking possession of the Scranton Register. In 1913 he was a member of the legislature from Bowman county. The family removed to Hope to again take up their residence only a few months

Theo. Curry was married to Miss Otillia Borgerson, of this city in 1903. Four children were born to them, the youngest being three weeks old. Besides his wife and children he leaves to mourn his death, his mother, father, three brothers and four sisters.
