

CLARA GREEN- LAND IS DEAD

**Eldrest Daughter of Mr. and Mrs. F.
Greenland of Cooperstown, Died
Monday Evening**

Clara Julia Greenland died Monday evening at 7:15 o'clock, at the home of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. F. Greenland, of Cooperstown, after an illness of two months. The cause of her death was dropsy.

Miss Greenland was born in Fillmore county, Minnesota, Aug. 12, 1877. She moved to Griggs county with her parents in 1881. She spent a good many years as teacher, and taught the first school in Binford, holding that position for several terms, at the same time proving up her homestead near town. She attended the Normal school at Valley City, and later acted as deputy superintendent of schools under Supt. I. A. Kampen. Since retiring from that office she has lived at home with her parents.

Miss Greenland had been in indifferent health for a number of years. Twenty-three years ago and again five years ago, she was stricken with rheumatic fever, and it is believed these spells left her heart impaired thus indirectly causing her last illness and death. All the care and love that skilled physicians and an anxious household could devise and apply for her comfort and assistance were brought into play, but the will of Him who rules our incomings and outgoings had been issued and after a long struggle, despite the prayers and entreaties of all who knew and loved her, the sufferer's spirit took its flight to that home the Christian believes is the fulfillment of the life everlasting.

She ran the journey of her life in thirty-eight years. It is a path marked with deeds of kindness and cheer. She was a member of the Lutheran church and an earnest and faithful worker in the Sunday School. Truth was the inspiration of her life and by kindness she exemplified its great worth.

The funeral services were held today at 2:00 o'clock at the church in Cooperstown, the pastor, Rev. T. E. Sweger, officiating.

Miss Greenland leaves to mourn her death her father and mother, three brothers, Oscar of Binford, Magnus, of Aneta, Ingvald of near Cooperstown, and a sister, Nora of Binford; another sister, Minnie, died nine years ago. Beside her relatives she had many friends who sincerely regret her death, and as the last good-bys are said will feel a loss has been sustained for which there is no compensation. May time bring its resignation, and may the shores of eternity that receives her soul, surround it with everlasting sunshine and flowers.
