

## Passed Away.

Ole Isaacson, who for 35 years was a bachelor farmer near Binford N. D., and who became an inmate of the Old People Home at Northwood, N. D., on Feb, 14, 1914, passed away at that institution at 4 o'clock p. m., on Tuesday, July 17, 1917. He would have been 62 years of age had he lived until September first next. He had been ill for some six years, and for the past five years has been helpless with paralysis and suffered greatly, death finally coming as a merciful relief to his tried soul. Prior to coming to the Home, he lived with his sister, Mrs. Ella Berg, of LaMoure, N. D., now of Cogswell N. D., for a time. Mrs. Berg and another sister, Mrs. Betsey Otterbolt, of Chetak, Wis., were here for the funeral which was held from the home on Wednesday afternoon, and the remains were shipped on the 5 o'clock train, the same afternoon, to Chetak, Wisconsin where funeral services will be held, and the remains interred in the cemetery where a brother and his parents repose. Mr. Isaacson is also survived by another sister, Mrs. Martha Vintrum, 4040 N. Western Ave., Chicago, Ill., and a brother, Lewis Isaacson of Chetak Wis.—The Northwood Gleaner.
