Neis A. Lee Dead.

Nels A. Lee, a prominet farmer of Rosendal township, died at his home, one and a half mile northeast of Mose, early last Thursday morning, Oct. 25, after a lingering illness of two years.

Deceased was born in Christian-sand, Norway, Jan. 3, 1868. He emigrated to America in 1893, remaining in Chicago a short time and then moving to Elbow Lake, Minnesota, where he farmed up until 1899. He then came to this county and filed on a homestead where he has lived since, with the exception of a few years at Fergus Falls.

He was married in 1900 and five children were born to this union, two of whom are dead, the others living at home. The children are: Norman, Ernest and Grant.

Mr. Lee was first taken sick two years ago with cancer. He sought relief in the hospitals at Minneapolis and Rochester, but gradually kept failing, and when he returned from Minneapolis about a month ago, it was noticed that the end was near.

The funeral was held last Saturday, short services being held at the house before going to the Zions Lutheran church, Rev. Haugen of McHenry, officiating.
