

Two big engines came up the branch as far as Cooperstown Sunday and a special train of thirty cars was made up, every car loaded to capacity with wheat shipped out by the elevators at Cooperstown and Lovell, Jessie, Binford, Mose and McHenry. These specials are in addition to the regular daily trains, which are heavily loaded with grain from these points. It is estimated that no less than 50,000 bushels were taken out on the special and the two engines had all they could do to get the heavy train under way. Griggs county raised an enormous crop of all small grains this year and with the favorable weather of the past two weeks it has been marketed at a lively rate.
