

SUSPECTS MAY BE MURDERERS

**Men Arrested for G. N. Holdup Bear
Bullet Wounds Recently
Inflicted.**

Crookston Times: Sheriff Kelly has every reason to believe that two of the men captured by Deputy Sheriff Bolstad a day or so ago at Dugdale know something about the murder of Chief of Police Nelson of Carrington, N. D., who met his death a few days ago while attempting to arrest pool room bandits. The men suspected of the crime are Oscar Weissel and Alexander Grey. Harry Myers was also arrested at the same time by Deputy Sheriff Bolstad, the men being wanted for holding up a party of 15 harvest hands on a Great Northern freight Monday evening.

Weissel and Grey both bear the scars of bullet marks on their arms which from all appearances were inflicted a week or ten days ago. All three suspects were known to have been in the vicinity of Carrington at the time that Chief Nelson was shot and it is the belief of the local officials that the right men have been arrested. The men have refused to answer all questions that have been asked them and have maintained a stolid indifference apparently as to what becomes of them.

An examination of the body of Weissel by county officials showed that he has 14 bullet wounds on different parts of his body, several of which are of a fresh nature, not being fully healed, while those on the other man are also of fresh origin.

All three were photographed in many different positions. The photographs will be sent to the rogues' gallery of all nearby cities.

The sheriff of Carrington county has been notified of the arrest of the suspects, who according to the descriptions sent out tally exactly with the men now being held here. It is expected that North Dakota officers will arrive in Crookston to examine the prisoners.

All three were to have appeared before Judge Gossman in municipal court and it is quite probable that the men will be held to the grand jury by that official on account of the holdup on the G. N. freight.
