

GRIGGS COUNTY CAME ACROSS

**Exceeded the Liberty Loan Quota By
Nearly \$40,000—Binford Makes
Good Record.**

The Griggs County Liberty Loan committee, of which Oscar Greenland, of Binford, is chairman, went over the top and into the trenches gave the Kaiser a bat in the slats—and captured enough equipment to put 3,082,000 Boches on the casualty list—providing each bullet hits the bull's eye. In other words, the Griggs county quota of \$115,000 was oversubscribed by \$39,100, making a total of \$154,100, divided among some 800 purchasers.

Binford made an excellent showing. Of the \$20,800 subscribed here every cent was made by individual subscriptions, which means \$64 per capita of our 325 population. The Times feels a pardonable pride in boasting of this record.

But don't overlook Willow township—the banner of them all—where practically every farmer in the township did his bit and then some. Not content with a goal of \$10,000 which they thought would be a generous sum, and it was, they threw in a couple more thousand for good measure. We doff our hat to Willow.
