

A move is on foot to drain Fuller's lake east of town. It is thought a ditch two miles long, five feet deep and seven feet wide at the top, will accomplish this purpose. The cost of such a channel is estimated at about \$3,000, to be paid mostly by those owning the land, but probably the county and towns will bear a share of the burden. It is said that about 1,200 acres of what is now worthless, may be cropped, if this move proves a success. A natural outlet lies about two mile north and by reaching it properly, it is thought the lake can be drained. One great objection, as told The Pioneer is that the soil is so soft and sandy that it is feared such a ditch could not be kept open, for lack of fall sufficient to carry the water away. A committee appointed some time ago, by the county commissioners, met last Saturday with several tax payers to consider the matter. Experts will probably be consulted and the matter given proper consideration.
