

## MEMORIAL DAY.

Programme for May 30, 1896.

George P. Foster Post and Sons of Veterans will form in front of the G. A. R. hall on Steele avenue at 10:45 o'clock a. m. headed by the Hope Cornet Band.

General orders from department headquarters will be read by the adjutant after which the column will counter march to the front of the town hall where they will meet the school children and citizens in procession.

The column will then be reformed for the march to the cemetery in the following order.

Hope Cornet Band,

School children,

George P. Foster Post,

Sons of Veterans,

Other societies and citizens.

The column will move at 11 o'clock a. m. and proceed direct to the cemetery.

On arriving at the cemetery the opening exercises will begin with:

Invocation by the chaplain,

Song by the male quartette,

Address by Comrade Ex-Gov. E. D. Wallace.

Music by the Hope Cornet Band.

Exercises by the Sons of Veterans,

Exercises entitled "Columbia" performed by twelve little girls, and twelve little boys followed by decorating the graves and cenotaph by all the children.

Firing salute.

The return march.

The marshals of the day will be Thomas Ward and Laor King.

The exercises in the town hall will begin at 2 o'clock p. m. An interesting programme has been prepared for the afternoon. Hon. L. B. Hanna, of Page, will deliver the oration.

In the evening will be given the very interesting entertainment, entitled "A Photographic History of the War", for the union, representing just how things looked at the front during the war. This entertainment will be given at the town hall, on the evenings of the 20th, and 30th. Children will purchase their tickets at the door on the evenings of the entertainment.
