

COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS.**Official Proceedings of the Board of
County Commissioners of
Steele County.**

(Continued from last week.)

Sherbrooke, N. D., July 20, 1896.

Board of county commissioners met at 10 o'clock a. m., pursuant to adjournment. Present, Chairman Rindy, and Commissioners Brown, Williams, Cochran and King.

The minutes of the meeting of July 13, 1896, were read and approved.

The following bills were on motion allowed and ordered paid from the county general fund:

The bill of the Tribune Job Printing Co., for examination sheets and other supplies, \$27.25, was on motion allowed and ordered paid at \$22.55.

On motion the board adjourned until 1:30 o'clock p. m.

Board reconvened at 1:30 o'clock p. m. Present, all members.

The bill of Newburgh township, for lumber furnished for approaches for county bridges, \$83.23, was on motion allowed and ordered paid from the bridge fund at \$79.54.

The board proceeded to examine the accounts and vouchers of the county treasurer.

The accounts of the county treasurer, having been examined and found correct, were on motion accepted and approved.

On motion the county treasurer and the county auditor were directed to make a statement of the financial affairs of the county for the year ending June 30, 1896, in compliance with section 1807, revised codes of 1895, and to cause said statement to be published in the Hope Pioneer and the Steele County Tribune.

On motion the Steele County Tribune was designated as the paper in which to publish a list of real estate, to be advertised the first week in September, for delinquent taxes for the year 1895.

The bill of Wm. Anderson for 14½

days work in auditor's office, \$32.62, was on motion allowed and ordered paid out of the penalty and interest fund.

The petition of Charles W. Connor, county surveyor, asking the board to provide copies of the original field notes and plats of the government surveys of all lands in Steele county, was on motion laid on the table.

The county auditor was on motion instructed to attend the meeting of the state board of equalization, to be held at Bismarck on Monday August 10, 1896, in the interest of a just equalization of the Steele county assessment.

On motion the board adjourned until 10 o'clock a. m. Monday, September 7, 1896.
