The bid of F R Rugg, offering to furnish 25 tons of hard stove coal, delivered on cars at Hope, for \$7.50 per ton, being the lowest received, on motion same was accepted and contract awarded.

The bid of Sanford Plumb, offering to haul the coal from Hope to Sherbrooke for 80 cents per ton, was on motion accepted and contract awarded.

An application from James Scott, of Willow Lake Township, asking for an abatement of the 1894 taxes, on S. hf. & N. W. qr. of S. W. qr. Section 35, Twp. 144, Range 57, was received. On motion said application was favorably recommended to the consideration of the State Auditor.

B Pendergrast presented an affidavit to the Board, stating that during the year 1894 he was assessed in the Incorporated Town of Hope, that the assessor of said town entered up against him \$1.00 as dog tax, that he was not then, nor has he since, been the owner or keeper of a dog, and ask that said dog tax be abated and cancelled. On motion the dog tax, for the year 1894, against Mr. Pendergrast was ordered cancelled.
