

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS of the Board of County Commissioners.

Sherbrooke, N. D., October 7th, 1895.

Board of County Commissioners met in regular session at 10 o'clock a. m. Present, Chairman Brown, and Commissioners Williams, Cochrane, Rindy and King.

The minutes of the meeting of July 20th., 1895, were read and approved.

At least one-half to be delivered by November 15th. and balance by December 15th. 1895. Also all bids for hauling said coal from Hope, and depositing same in the basement under the Court-House at Sherbrooke. Said bids to be opened at 2 o'clock p. m. on Saturday, October 26, 1895.

On motion the Steele County Tribune was designated as the paper in which to publish notice of sale of real estate, for taxes delinquent for the year 1894.

On motion an application of Martin D. Johnson, for a license to act as auctioneer, in Steele County, from September 9th. 1895, to September 9th. 1896, was granted and a license ordered issued.
