At the term of court held last week there were four criminal and fifteen civil cases. D. vs. Frank Henderson, a blind pig case, defendant pleaded guilty and was discharged having been in jail since last fall; State of N. D. vs. Roy Harvey was dismissed defendant having been in jail since last fall; Jas. Sperbeck vs. Frank Dann was dismissed; Heskin Bros. vs. H. Foss, judgement for plaintiff with stay of 60 days. Ward & Murray vs. Jas. McQueen, judgement for plaintiff; McCormick Harvester Co. vs. Ole Wesith, settled; International Harvester Co. vs. J. C. Foster, judgement for plaintiff. Judge Pollock effected a settlement between Foster Bros. thus settling cases 11, 12, 14 and 15 without trial; I. W. Stanley vs. W. Picken, judgement for plaintiff by stipulation in open court; International Harvester Co. vs. I. M. Stordal judgement for plaintiff by stipulation; W. F. Hayes vs. Martha and A. W. Cooley, judgement for defendant; Petition of Nancy J. Doyle Adm. to set aside the homestead of Jas. Doyle, deceased, denied.
